

Did you know ?

The District 5 Schoolhouse location was the oldest school district in Underhill Center dating back to 1891.

The Old Schoolhouse sits on one of the earliest occupied sites in the village.

Thomas Cale, among the first Congressional delegates from Alaska, taught at the Schoolhouse in 1867 and 1868.

Hundreds of Underhill residents attended class at the District 5 Schoolhouse, some of whom still reside here in town.

The schoolhouse suffered a fire and was abandoned as a school in 1951.

The schoolhouse was used as a garage for the school bus, for equipment storage, and as a salt shed.

The schoolhouse was originally a single story building

The schoolhouse was restored to its original appearance after a five year restoration effort in 1989.

The schoolhouse is listed on the Vermont State Historic Sites and Structures Survey.

The schoolhouse is the last of the original 15 schoolhouses still in public hands.

The schoolhouse has no indoor plumbing, limiting its public use.

The schoolhouse is in a state of decay, needing extensive repair.

The schoolhouse can still be used for your group activity.

The schoolhouse is one of only four buildings the town of Underhill owns and has received little attention for 30 years.

The schoolhouse is a valuable town asset that we can't continue to neglect.
