

OPEN CONTAINER ORDINANCE

It is HEREBY ORDAINED by the Selectmen of the Town of Underhill as follows:

Alcohol - Public Places

1. Definitions

As used in this ordinance the following terms shall be defined as follows:

- (a) open beverage container- a container, bottle, can, or vessel containing malt or vinous beverages or spiritous liquors which is or has been opened.
- (b) public place - a public place shall mean any bridge culvert, roadway, street, square, fairground, sidewalk, alley, playground, park or school property or other place open temporarily or permanently to the public or general circulation of vehicles or pedestrians with the Town of Underhill.

2. Prohibitions

Except as authorized in subsection (c) hereof:

- (a) No person shall have constructive or actual possession of an open beverage container in any public place or in any motor vehicle located in a public place.
- (b) No person shall consume the contents of an open beverage container in any public place or in any motor vehicle in a public place.
- (c) Notwithstanding subparagraphs 2(a) and 2(b) hereof, the Board of Selectmen may give specific prior approval, upon application, for possession and consumption from open beverage containers, including beer kegs, on Town owned property.

3. Penalties

Persons convicted on violating this section shall be fined not more than Two Hundred and no/100 Dollars (\$200.00).
