Jumping Worms—What is New?

Thursday, March 30, 7:00pm-8:15pm





This presentation by Dr. Josef Gorres will give a brief introduction to the threat that jumping worms pose to our forests, gardens, and no-till agriculture—why do we care? The latest research on how to manage them is reviewed, and an outlook is given on this year's research agenda what can we do?

Josef Gorres is a Professor of ecological soil management at the University of Vermont. He is a physicist by training, but his research is in soil science and ecology. He has been studying jumping worms in Vermont for 12 years. Other projects he is involved in are soil erosion and improving restoration of riparian areas with mycorrhizae.
